At the request of Emory L. Balderson, President of the Commissioners of Oxford, we are contacting you regarding the status of the Save Oxford School effort.


We are in the process of organizing the Oxford Community Center, Inc. as a tax exempt organization. The Board of Trustees will be responsible for the restoration, operation, and maintenance of the Oxford Community Center.

Enclosed is the SOS Committee Report which was submitted to the Commissioners of Oxford in February which generally outlines the conclusions reached by the Committee and which will serve as a guideline for the Board of Trustees.

We plan to raise the initial money to preserve the building from the funds the Town would have used to demolish the building and from private sources. Funds for the continuing operation and maintenance will come from income derived by the Center and from private sources, but specifically not from the Town of Oxford; the Center is intended to be self supporting.

The Board of Trustees for the Oxford Community Center, Inc. plans to hold an organizational meeting the week of June 23, 1980 and will report to you afterwards.
